## STATEMENT ANALYSIS

Mark McClish, Advanced Interviewing Concepts  
(United States Marshal Service, retired)

There are usually several ways you can phrase a statement. People will always word their statement based on all their knowledge. Therefore, their statement may contain information they did not intend to share. In his presentation, Mark McClish, retired from the U.S. Marshals Service in 2009, will show you what to look for in verbal and written statements to detect deception and to obtain additional information. Mark has appeared on the ABC show 20/20 and has helped solve cases featured on Unsolved Mysteries. He is the author of the book, "I Know You Are Lying."

## BOSTON U-30 ROBBERY CREW

Randy Jarvis, Mark Onorato & Steve Wohlgemuth (FBI-Boston, Massachusetts State Police)

Randy has been with the FBI for 15 years, 13 of which have been in the FBI's violent crime program. Randy has served as case agent and supervisor for multiple armed bank robbery crews, kidnappings, armored car cases. Steve spent 7 years as deputy sheriff before moving on to the Massachusetts State Police where he has investigated violent crime for the last 12 years. Mark is a 15 year FBI veteran who has flown both fixed and rotary wing aircraft. He currently supervises the Boston Office's SOG and Aviation programs.

Randy and Steve will walk us through a very intense gang robbery crew investigation and highlight the techniques used to capture and take them down. Mark will present a related segment on the **Use of Air Support in Robbery Investigations**.

## GANG ROBBERY INVESTIGATIONS

Mike Thrapp, Aurora Police Department  
(Rocky Mountain Safe Streets Task Force)

Mike has been with the Aurora Police Department for 29 years, including: 8 years in Intelligence, 8 years in the Gang Unit and, currently, 3 years in the Rocky Mountain Safe Streets Task Force. Mike is considered an expert in gang investigations and has testified as such. He teaches many investigative subjects at Community College of Colorado.

Mike will use recent successful gang robbery investigations to illustrate investigative techniques, interrogation practices and other skills necessary to investigate the often difficult gang cases. Also included will be a very informative segment on the **Use of Social Media in investigations**.

## SERIAL ROBBERY INVESTIGATION

Mark Woodward, Denver Police Department  
(Rocky Mountain Safe Streets Task Force)

Mark is a 36 year veteran of the Denver Police Department, 25 years of which he has spent in the Criminal Investigations Division. He worked in the Robbery Detail for 15 years before being assigned to the FBI's Rocky Mountain Safe Streets Task Force, a violent crimes task force, where he has worked for the last 7 years. Mark is currently the Bank Robbery Coordinator for the Denver Division.

Mark's lecture will cover the many aspects of a serial robbery investigation with a heavy emphasis on physical and electronic surveillance. Also included will be a segment on **Investigative Pitfalls**.
